Topics such as weather, airspace, charts, lat longs and hazardous attitudes will be covered. If you are flying a drone for reasons other than a hobbyist, the FAA says you must have a Part 107 Drone Pilots License.

Examples: Search & Rescue, Damage Assessment, Traffic Reconstruction, Overwatch for Commercial & Residential Fires. These are just a few examples where you must be a certified drone pilot.

Upon completion of the class, you you have the knowledge to take and pass the FAA 60 question test offered near you.
